This agreement is applicable to students who complete the required hours for the Associate in Applied Science degree in Criminal Justice Technology from Sandhills Community College and transfer to the University of North Carolina at Pembroke (UNCP) and major in Criminal Justice. Transfers who have not completed the associate degree will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Regardless of hours transferred, students will be required to complete at least nineteen (19) hours in Criminal Justice from the University of North Carolina Pembroke.
