Bilateral Transfer Agreement between Fayetteville State University and Sandhills Community College, for the Bachelor of Science - Fire and Emergency Services Administration (BS)

Rationale

As a four-year N.C. public university, fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Fayetteville State University (FSU) enters into this articulation agreement with Sandhills Community College (SCC). This agreement furthers the efforts of both institutions to meet the educational needs of the citizens of North Carolina and to work cooperatively to improve access to higher education in their respective service districts. This agreement will pertain to those Sandhills Community College students who earn an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) Degree in Fire Protection Technology (A55240) through Sandhills Community College, and who seek to complete their Bachelor of Science Degree through the Fayetteville State University Fire and Emergency Services Administration Program.

Transferring Student Requirements and Provisions

- A student entering with an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Fire Protection Technology from Sandhills Community College as designated in this agreement will be enrolled with Junior class status at Fayetteville State University, with all the privileges and benefits available to students already enrolled at FSU, including application for financial assistance, eligibility for academic honors, student activities, development services, and social opportunities.
- A student transferring to FSU under this agreement shall have academic credits earned at SCC with a grade of C and above with the condition that all requirements for graduation from SCC meet the program of study for FSU as detailed in this articulation agreement.
- SCC students will enter FSU with 66 semester hours of credit, which will fulfill their General Education Core curriculum requirements for their B.S. Degree in Fire and Emergency Services Administration at FSU. However, circumstances may arise when a student, if equivalent coursework or certifications are not completed, may need to additionally complete three (3) semester hours credit from the Humanities/Creative Arts requirement. Students may also need additional FIP lower-level courses.

Admission to Fayetteville State University and the Fire and Emergency Services Administration Program

- Students wishing to engage in this articulation agreement must have been awarded an A.A.S. Degree in Fire Protection Technology (A55240) as specified in this agreement from Sandhills Community College.
- 2. Accepted students articulating from Sandhills Community College shall be considered a "transfer student" (as described in the FSU Catalog at the time of application) and, as such, must meet all requirements for admission to FSU under that status.
- 3. Students must meet a minimum grade point average of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale).

4. When FSU's Provost has received all the appropriate documents for admission (as listed in the FSU Catalog at the time of application), including an official transcript from Sandhills Community College the student will be notified of acceptance to FSU by the Provost.

Agreement

Fayetteville State University and Sandhills Community College will enter this agreement beginning with the Spring semester of the 2024-2025 academic year. This document will be reviewed on a bi- annual basis and revised as needed to ensure compliance with all local, state and national accrediting bodies' policies and expectations. This agreement may be terminated by either institution by submitting a written notice of intent at least 90 days in advance. Likewise, any addenda to this agreement should be agreed to in writing by both institutions.

Both FSU and SCC give mutual assurance that in performing their duties under this agreement, they will not discriminate on the basis of age, ancestry, citizenship status, color, disability, gender, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, veteran status, or another protected group. Reasonable accommodations for participation by disabled persons will be made in compliance with Section 504 of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Course of Study

The following is the four-year course of study plan for students beginning at Sandhills Community College and completing their B.S. Degree in Fire and Emergency Services Administration at Fayetteville State University. Since this program has been designed to meet specific educational goals based upon the two participating institutions in this agreement, students should be made aware that this particular course of study is guaranteed only to meet the transfer requirements into the Fire and Emergency Services Administration Program at FSU. Course substitutions will not be considered unless preapproved by the Dean of Broadwell College of Business and Economics.
